## NECESSITOUS CLOTHING ALLOWANCE SCHEME, 2018 ONWARDS



### **RATIONALE**

As a Church of England Primary School, we seek to further the work of Christ by expecting, nurturing and demonstrating the Fruits of the Spirit (Galatians 5) in our day to day lives. The Fruits of the Spirit include Love, Joy, Peace, Goodness, Kindness, Patience, Gentleness, Faithfulness and Self-control.

At Moordown St. John's we also aim to honour and fulfil the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child.

'Rights' are things every child should have or be able to do. All children have the same rights. These rights are listed in the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child. Almost every country has agreed to these rights. All the rights are connected to each other, and all are equally important. Sometimes, we have to think about rights in terms of what is best for children in a situation, and what is critical to life and protection from harm. As children grow, they have more responsibility to make choices and exercise their rights. This policy refers directly to the following article:

**Article 26** – Governments must provide extra money for the children of families in need.

### **SUCCESS**

**SUCCESS** (Skills, Understanding, Creativity, Curiosity, Enjoyment, Spirituality, Security) is at the centre of our school's ethos and identity.

**S** – **Skills** that embed knowledge for a life full of learning and healthy relationships

**U** – **Understanding** how knowledge and concepts can be applied and built upon to achieve deep learning

**C** – **Creativity** to use skills and knowledge imaginatively to express oneself and solve problems

**C** – **Curiosity** to explore, investigate and understand the world

**E** – **Enjoyment** of life and of learning

**S** – **Spirituality** where faith is nourished, respected, challenged and lived

**S** – **Security** in themselves and who they are to reach their full potential

### **What is the Necessitous Clothing Scheme?**

The School may provide eligible parents/carers with money towards clothing to ensure their child is sufficiently and suitably dressed for attendance at this school.

- Help is provided in the form of a 'clothing grant' towards the cost of basic school clothing needs (e.g. school shoes/school uniform/PE kit/school coat etc)
- Any items of clothing bought with the grant must be suitable for attendance at this school.
- Children in the care of the authority (e.g. a foster child) or of a voluntary organisation are not eligible for a necessitous clothing grant.
- The scheme is available for children in Years R – 5 at Moordown St John's CE Primary School.

### **Who is entitled to a Clothing Grant?**

Families who are entitled to Income-Based Free School Meals for their child/children are eligible to claim our clothing grant ie parents/carers who are in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Income Support
- Income based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit

- Child Tax Credit where the parent is not entitled to Working Tax Credit and whose income (as assessed by the Inland Revenue) does not exceed £16,190.
- Universal Credit where the household income is less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits)

To access the clothing grant, parents/carers are required to apply for Income-Based Free School Meals, even if their child is in Years R – 2 and therefore entitled to Universal Free School Meals, as this provides the school with the funding necessary to operate the scheme.

All applications for Income-Based Free School Meals are processed on our behalf by Bournemouth Council. The Council will advise the school when your eligibility is confirmed.

### **How much is the grant?**

A grant of £35 is payable for each eligible child.

### **How often can parents apply for a grant?**

Pupils are considered for a grant every 2 years. In exceptional circumstances it is possible to consider a further request for financial assistance during this period, e.g. clothing destroyed in a fire, a medical condition that affects growth, or where the child has changed school due to a change of address as a result of a potentially violent situation at home.

### **How do parents apply for a grant?**

Parents/carers should complete the Application Form attached to this policy and return it to the School Office. *Please note the requirement to also apply for Income Based Free School Meals.*

Sometimes the School may wish to discuss the application in greater detail with the family before any decision is made.

Those who have their application turned down have the right of appeal to the Directors.

### **How will the grant be paid?**

Once the completed application form has been received by the school and eligibility for Income-Based Free School Meals has been confirmed by the Council, payment of the grant will be BACs transfer direct to the applicant's bank account. If parents/carers do not have a bank account please indicate this on the application form. Thank you.

### **Policy Review**

Having been carefully considered, this policy has been ratified and approved by the Headteacher on 18 April 2018.

This policy will be updated in April every year in line with any changes to the Income-Based Free School Meal eligibility criteria; the next update will be due in April 2019.

A full review of the policy will take place after an interval of three years. As the last full review was in 2016, the next one will take place in April 2019. This review date will be brought forward should changes in protocol be recommended by the Department for Education, the Local Authority and/or the Diocese.
